## New Church Formed in Kiski Presbytery

The Kiskiminetas Presbytery met in a stated meeting at First Church, Clarion at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 28. Worship was led by host pastor Rev. Kirk Orr and Rev. Gary Lyon. Gary and wife Lisa are co-pastors of the newly formed Cross Roads Community Presbyterian Church in Leechburg. His sermon "Thrive - Grow - Change" was reflective of the hope of the new congregation as well as challenging to already existing congregations.

### Money Matters

Presbytery received the proposed 2006 budget as a first reading and action was taken to adopt a presbytery per capita of \$15.69. Presbytery also approved a 2% increase in the 2006 Minimum Terms of Call and an increase of \$100 in the study leave allowance for ministers.

### Diversity Encouraged

Soga Ewedemi, Chair of the Committee on Representation, recommended several proposals to encourage diversity in our church membership as well as in our pulpit supply contingent.

### Warm Bodies NOT Needed

Rev. Lisa Lyon spoke for the Nominations Committee, which is seeking to broaden the pool of nominees for presbytery committees. The committee needs people who are answering God's call to service. Ellen Lawrence was elected to succeed Michael Wilson as Chair of the Administration Committee.

### PW Highlights

Moderator Sally Early reported that 18 women from Kiski attended the Synod Gathering in June. She also noted upcoming calendar events - the picnic in July, September mission trip to New Windsor, MD, and Fall Gathering at East Brady.

### Programs to Support Your Church

Rev. Erin Cox-Holmes highlighted presbytery-sponsored events in the 2005-06 program year: Clergy Retreat, Wills & Endowments Seminar, Fall Transformation with Houston Hodges, Leader Training with Israel Galindo, Multimedia in Worship with Michael Bausch, and Presbytery Day with Dennis Dewey. A Spring Youth Rally will take place as a stand-alone event in April of 2006.

### Inquirer Dan Clark Introduced

Rev. Bob Goossen encouraged prayer for the presbytery's Inquirers and Candidates. Dan Clark of the Clarion church was introduced. Art. Seaman and Rosalie Brown were named as ordination exam readers.

### Recognition of Service

Executive Presbyter Wayne Yost recognized those ministers who are honorably retired or members at large who are celebrating special ordination anniversaries, and he presented certificates to those present. Sue Ann Murray, Kwasi Yirenyki, Bob Henry, John Foester, Sam Phoebus, Thom Prosser, Bill Starr, and Vin Stratton were honored.

### From 2 to New

The Action Team from the Calvary and Gray Stone Churches in Leechburg displayed banners and described the process used to unite those two congregations to form the Cross Roads Community Presbyterian Church of Leechburg. A plan of union was approved.

- ▶ The Presbytery will provide resources, training, and programming to assist Sessions in educational ministries. Areas of focus will include:
  - Church School Support and Teacher Development
  - Leadership Development for ministers, elders, deacons, and clerks of session
  - Worship and Spiritual Formation/Development
  - Youth Ministry
- ▶ The Presbytery will develop a strategic plan for sharing pastoral leadership, merging, and/or closing of congregations with severely limited ability to maintain a vital mission and ministry.
- ▶ The Presbytery will be a faithful partner with the Synod and General Assembly in mission interpretation and support.
- ▶ The Presbytery will support Sessions which are seeking to address pressing social and economic issues affecting the communities in which they minister.
- ▶ The Presbytery will seek to hear and to respond to God’s call for justice and social righteousness and to call the churches of the Presbytery to do the same.

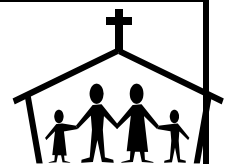

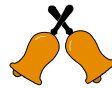
We will (God willing) complete the task this coming Wednesday night by attaching actual strategies to this purpose which will make it real in our mission to this community!

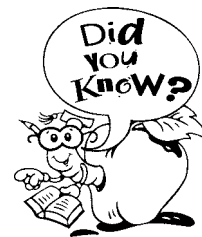
### Mortgage Burning
